

Our May 3rd Facilitator Meeting


During our last facilitator meeting on May 3rd, Andrea Bass expertly led the session and shared a wealth of insights. Her guidance provided valuable information on effectively engaging with children who are experiencing grief.

Andrea is a former Associate Director of Josie's Place for Grieving Children with Pat Murphy, Director and Founder, in San Francisco, California (also modeled after the Dougie Center). She is a licensed Marriage Family Therapist, Board-certified art therapist and worked at Hospice By the Bay in SF and Marin for more than 10 years as Youth Bereavement Specialist.

Andrea has a private practice in the Bay Area and works with many grieving children, teens, and parents. Andrea planned and facilitated training and supervision for interns at Josie's Place, provided grief support groups for children in the SF public schools for 10 years, and worked at Camp Erin, grief support group for 10 years as well. (And although Andrea does not mention it in her bio, she is an accomplished visual artist.).

Nancy Pechner's, **Them Before Me**, a powerful work of memoir and healing, traces her journey from intergenerational trauma and grief, and a childhood of emotional chaos, to forgiveness and healing of heart and soul.

Nancy is generously donating half of all her book proceeds to Nā Keiki O Emalia and the rest to other non-profits. Her commitment to supporting grieving children, teens, and their families is truly admirable.
